## ADMISSION TO LL.M COURSE, 2015-16 FIRST PHASE OF ALLOTMENT PUBLISHED

The first phase of Centralised Allotment for admission to LL.M Courses in Government Law Colleges and Private Self Financing Law Colleges in the State for the year 2015-16 is published herewith on the website www.cee.kerala.gov.in. The allotment is based on the online options registered up to 5 pm on 04.03.2016.

Candidates shall have to click <u>'LL.M 2015-Candidate Portal'</u> available in the website www.cee.kerala.gov.in. After that the candidates have to enter their Application Number and Roll Number in order to access their home page. Then by clicking the menu item 'Allotment Result' and by submitting their key number and password, candidates can download their Allotment Memo. The details such as candidate's name, roll number, allotted college, Allotment category, tuition fees to be paid etc. are available in the allotment memo. The candidate shall take a printout of the allotment memo and produce it before the College Authorities at the time of admission.

Candidates who receive allotment should report for admission to the Principal of the allotted colleges on any date from 09.03.2016 to 14.03.2016, along with the allotment memo and original documents specified in Clause 17 of the Prospectus. They should remit the fees as shown in the Allotment memo in the allotted college at the time of admission. All the college authorities should approve and submit the list of admitted candidates through the link 'Approval of Admission list of Candidates' in the home page of the Online Admission Management System (OAMS) at 5.30 p.m. on 14.03.2016.

The candidates who do not join the College with in the stipulated time will lose their present allotment and also their higher order options. They will not be considered for further online allotments.
